Domino's raises dough for The Salvation Army

Domino's 81 stores across Sydney are hoping to raise more than \$20,000 for The Salvation Army, with Domino's doughraiser days on Monday's throughout November, with support from Channel 10.

Kicking off on Monday 2 November, Domino's will donate \$1 from every pizza sold on November 2, 9 and 16 to The Salvation Army, one of the largest most diverse social welfare providers in the world.

In a typical week, The Salvation Army in Australia provides 100,000 meals to people in need, beds to 5,000 homeless people, rehabilitation to 500 addicted and refuge to 400 victims of domestic abuse.

Domino's Sydney Franchise Operations Manager Ian Taunton said the franchisees are excited to help raise funds for The Salvation Army and hope lots of Sydney residents join the cause by purchasing pizzas on Monday's throughout November.

"We are happy to be contributing to The Salvation Army and uniting with the community to help the poor, destitute and hungry in Australia," Ian said.

"We hope to raise more than \$20,000 for The Salvation Army during our doughraiser days on November 2, 9 and 16.

"Our first doughraiser on Monday 2 November will be huge! We are thrilled to have The Salvation Army onboard for three doughraisers, and we are asking the community to come down and show their support.

"The Salvation Army is making a difference by helping Australians in their time of need. We hope the Sydney community follows our lead and joins forces with The Salvation Army to make a difference!

"Locally owned and operated, we strongly believe in giving back to the community and lending a helping hand where we can."

Major Philip Maxwell, head of Public Relations for The Salvation Army Eastern Australia, said The Salvation Army have seen a significant increase in the number of Australians struggling to make ends meet during the last 12 months.

"It's really tough for many families right now. Funds are desperately needed and the doughraiser days will be a great way for people to support our work," Major Maxwell said.

All 81 Domino's stores across Sydney are taking part in the doughraisers joining forces to raise money for The Salvation Army.
